Heisler #3 Water Tank Repairs

The following information was extrapolated from Facebook posts in whole or in part.

January 22, 2025: Two separate posts included the first two photos.

Eric Wunz posted "Mr. Tholen has started welding in the new pieces on the #3s water tank. Looking good. Not easy accurately replicating the historical appearance, appreciate his efforts to do so".

Jim Grigsby wrote "We talked about keeping the historic dent in this corner, but it would have been too complicated. We don't know the story of the dent but it was there when #3 came back from Idaho".

Taylor Rush responded "I think she got the big corner dent when she rolled on her side into the creek in the 1920s".

February 9, 2025: Included the third photo.

Eric Wunz posted "More steel has been welded in the #3s water tank. Good job replicating the rivets".

Eric Wunz posted "More work happening on the Heisler, other corner removed and the back large piece is fabricated and on site".

Eric Wunz posted "Doni was up today, last side piece is welded in and he is working on the internal bracing. Had to cut an access and ventilation hole and we agreed to keep it for future access. The lid will bolt down so it can be opened up as needed. With the internal bracing in it is a tight squeeze inside".

Eric Wunz posted "We were able to hang the rear sand box on the Heisler today. Doni got it bolted on and all that is left is to paint and letter. I appreciate all his work on this and it is looking great".

Still some leaks at the injectors and the brake stand needs an internal cleaning as it is not acting correctly. I will be back tomorrow to hopefully address the above issues".

Eric Wunz posted "Found my book on A-1 brake systems and worked some more on the Heisler's brake stand. Fired it up to run the air compressor and tested it with the train consist. Some more adjustments and now acting properly. Still has an extended blow at the brake stand in lap after reducing brake pipe pressure that does not affect functionality".
